Insect Hotel

For bees and ladybirds

In autumn bees (mason bees) will lay their eggs into wooden tubes and seal them up. In spring young bees will emerge. Mason bees are active between spring and autumn and pollinate fruit and flowers.

The ladybird beetle feels very comfortable in the bottom compartment of the Insect Hotel. It's a great place for breeding. Apart from being beautiful and a great experience for kids, ladybirds are the biggest enemy of the vine louse and greenfly. The beetles can visit the Insect Hotel for refuge at night and for overwintering.

Please note:

1. Hang the Gardigo Insect Hotel in a sunny spot, sheltered from wind and rain.
2. The entrance of the house should ideally face south.
3. Leave the hotel hanging in winter. Insects might be nesting and overwintering in it.
4. Do not varnish or paint the Gardigo Insect Hotel. The solvents or the paint might be harmful for the insects. The insects will also not like the smell and could avoid using the house.
